A PROCLAMATION.

GEORGE P. R.

WHEREAS it has been represented that a considerable Number of disorderly Persons, chiefly composed of Stockingers, or Persons employed in the Stocking Manufactories, have, for some Time past, assembled themselves together in a riotous and tumultuous Manner in the Town and County of the Town of Nottingham, and likewise in several Parts of the Counties of Nottingham, Derby; and Leicester; and for the Purpose of compelling their Employers to comply with certain Regulations prescribed by themselves with respect to Work, and the Wages to be paid for the same, have had Recourse to Measures of Force and Violence, and have actually committed various Acts of Outrage in different Parts of the Counties above-mentioned, whereby the Property of many of His Majesty's good Subjects has in several Instances been wholly destroyed, and their Lives and Properties are still greatly endangered; We therefore, acting in the Name and on the Behalf of His Majesty, being duly sensible of the mischievous Consequences which must inevitably ensue, as well to the Peace of the Kingdom as to the Lives and Properties of His Majesty's Subjects, from such wicked and illegal Practices, if they go unpunished, and being firmly resolved to cause the Laws to be put in Execution for the Punishment of such Offenders, have thought fit, by the Advice of His Majesty's Privy Council, to issue this Proclamation, hereby strictly commanding all Justices of the Peace, Sheriffs, Under Sheriffs, and all other Civil Officers whatsoever, within the said Town and County of the Town of Nottingham, and the said Counties of Nottingham, Derby, and Leicester respectively, that they do use their utmost Endeavours to discover, apprehend, and bring to Justice the Persons concerned in the riotous Proceedings above-mentioned: And, as a further Inducement to discover the said Offenders, We do hereby, acting as aforesaid, promise and declare that any Person or Persons who shall discover and apprehend, or cause to

be discovered and apprehended, the Authors, Abettors or Perpetrators of any of the Outrages above-mentioned, so that they or any of them may be duly convicted thereof, shall be entitled to the Sum of FIFTY POUNDS for each and every Person who shall be so convicted, and shall also receive His Majesty's most gracious Pardon for the said Offence, in case the Person making such Discovery as aforesaid shall be liable to be prosecuted for the same: And the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury are hereby required to make Payment accordingly of the said Reward.

Given at the Court at York House, the Eighteenth Day of December One thousand eight hundred and eleven, in the Fifty-second Year of His Majesty's Reign.

THE Marquess Wellesley, His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs, has this Day notified to the Ministers of friendly Powers resident at this Court, that His Royal Highness the Prince Regent, Acting in the Name and on the Behalf of His Majesty, has judged it expedient to direct that the necessary Measures should be taken to place the Entrance of the River Guadalquivir so far under the Restrictions of Blockade, that no Vessel shall be permitted to enter which shall have on board, Bread, Flour, Grain, Provisions of any kind whatever, (excepting such as may be fairly deemed Sea Stores for the Use of the Crew,) Warlike or Naval Stores, or any Article or Articles intended to be, or usually converted into Warlike or Naval Stores, and that all the Measures authorized by the Law of Nations, and the respective Treaties between His Majesty and the different Neutral Powers, be adopted and executed with respect to all Vessels laden as aforesaid, that may attempt to violate said Blockade.

A DISPATCH, of which the following is an Extract, was Yesterday Morning received at Lord Liverpool's Office, addressed to his Lordship by General Viscount Wellington, dated Frenada, 4th December 1811.

ACCORDING to the Intention which I communicated to your Lordship, I withdrew our Advanced Guard across the Aguada on the 29th.

Don Carlos D'Espagne has informed me, that he attacked the Enemy on the 28th of November, on their Retreat from the Sierra de Francia, between Miranda and Endrinal, with a Detachment of Don Julian Sanchez's Infantry and a Detachment of the Regiment de la Princesa. On their Arrival at Endrinal they were attacked by Don Julian Sanchez with his Cavalry, and were obliged to form in a Square.

Don Carlos informs me that the Enemy suffered considerable Loss; and that his Troops got Possession of some of the Money, of which the Enemy had plundered the Inhabitants of the Sierra de Francia.

Don Carlos D'Espagne mentions particularly the Conduct of Lieutenant William Reid, of the Royal Engineers, who attended him upon this Expedition, having before been employed to perform a Service under his Directions.

WHEREAS it has been humbly represented to His Royal Highness the Prince Regent, that between the Hours of Eleven and Twelve o'Clock on the Night of Thursday the 19th Instant, as the Watchman was going his Rounds in New Gravel-Lane, Shadwell, in the County of Middlesex, he observed a young Man, who was a Lodger at the Public House called the King's Arms, and kept by Mr. John Williamson, lowering himself down by Two Sheets from a Two-pair of Stairs Window, who told him that the Family were murdered, whereupon the Door was immediately broken open, and the Bodies of Mrs. Catherine Williamson and her Maid Servant, Bridget Harrington, were found murdered in the Tap-Room, and the said Mr. John Williamson was found in the Cellar in the same State;

His Royal Highness, for the better apprehending and bringing to Justice the Persons concerned in the said atrocious Murders, is hereby pleased; in the Name and on the Behalf of His Majesty, to promise His Majesty's most gracious Pardon to any one of them (except the Person or Persons who actually perpetrated the said Murders) who shall discover his or their Accomplice or Accomplices therein, so that he, she, or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.

And, as a further Encouragement, a Reward of FIVE HUNDRED POUNDS is hereby offered to

any Person making such Discovery as aforesaid (except as is before excepted), to be paid on the Conviction of any one or more of the Offenders by the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury.

LEGACY DUTY.

They are also desired to observe, that in filling up the Receipts it will be indispensably necessary to specify the Time when the Testator or Intestate died, and the Court where the Will was proved, or Letters of Administration granted; and also to state the Degree of Relationship of the Legatee or next of Kin, according to the Words of the Act of Parliament, which are printed for the Guidance of Executors and Administrators on the Back of the Receipts.

The Duties are to be paid within Twenty-one Days after the Date of the Receipts for Legacies and Residues, and the Receipts are to be dated on the Day of signing the same. Executors and Administrators paying Legacies and Residues without taking proper Receipts, and paying the Duties within the Time prescribed, and Legatees and next of Kin receiving Legacies and Residues without giving proper Receipts for the same, and allowing a Deduction of the Duties, will be respectively liable to Penalties of Ten per Cent. on the Amount of such Legacies or Residues.

And as the Commissioners will be furnished by the Ecclesiastical Courts with Copies of all Wills, and an Account of all Letters of Administration, they will know on whom to call for Payment of the Duties; and they will enforce the Payment thereof

by Suit in the Court of Exchequer, if not paid in due Time.

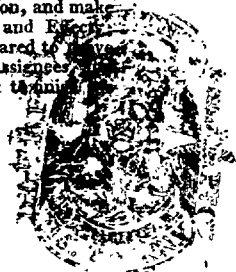
